# HAYCOCK TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE No. 3

The following ordinance will be acted upon by the Board of Supervisors of Haycock Township at its regular meeting to be held at Applebachsville Monday, December 31, 1956, at 7 p. m.

## ORDINANCE NO. 3

An ordinance of the Township Supervisors of Haycock Township, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, prohibiting the storage of abandoned and junked motor vehicles on public or private property within the Township and prescribing penalties for the violation of the provisions thereof.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS OF HAYCOCK TOWNSHIP, BUCKS COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

And it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that the storage of abandoned or junked motor vehicles on public or private property within the Township is hereby declared a nuisance and prohibited as is hereinafter provided.

Section 1. Short Title. This ordinance shall be known and may be cited as "Township of Haycock Abandoned and Junked Motor Vehicle Ordinance."

Section 2. Definitions. The following words and phrases, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates a different meaning.

(a) "Person"—Every natural person, association or corporation. Whenever in any clause prescribing or imposing a fine, or penalty of imprisonment in default thereof, the term as applied to associations shall mean any member thereof, and as applied to

corporations shall mean the President or Secretary thereof.

(b) "Junked Motor Vehicle"—Any motor vehicle outside of a fully enclosed building, not in working order, without current registration plates, and stored as junk metal or for the purpose of selling parts therefrom.

(c) "Abandoned Motor Vehicle"—Any motor vehicle outside of a fully enclosed building, without current registration plates, the last owner of which has by his neglect indicated an intention to relinquish his rights of ownership therein.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to store any abandoned or junked motor vehicle on private or public property within the geographical boundaries of the Township of Haycock, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, for a period exceeding thirty days. The storage of any motor vehicle as hereinbefore prohibited in this section for more than the period of thirty days shall constitute a separate and distinct unlawful act for each succeeding period of thirty days.

Section 4. Any person upon summary conviction before a Justice of the Peace of violating any of the provisions of Section 3 of this ordinance shall for the first offense be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00), and for each and every subsequent offense shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) nor more than Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) and in default thereof for a first or subsequent offense shall undergo imprisonment for not less than five (5) days nor more than thirty (30) days.

Section 5. All prosecutions shall be brought in the name of "Haycock Town-

ship" before any Justice of the Peace and shall be commenced by information and warrant and shall be directed to and be served by a constable. Warrants shall be returnable forthwith and upon such return like proceedings shall be had, as in case of summary conviction.

Section 6. The provisions of this ordinance are severable remaining sections, clauses, sentences, parts, or provisions thereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, the decision of the Court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences, parts, or provisions of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board of Township Supervisors of the Township of Haycock that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, clause, sentence, part or provision thereof shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, the decision of the Court shall not affect or impair any of the remaining sections, clauses, sentences, parts, or provisions of this ordinance. It is hereby declared to be the intent of the Board of Township Supervisors of the Township of Haycock that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid or unconstitutional section, clause, sentence, part, or provision had not been included therein.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective on the Seventh day of January, A. D., 1957.
